If you have granted your consent to receive information regarding future editions of the MIDI Conference, your data, i.e. your name, surname and e-mail address, will be processed based on point (a) of Article 6(1) of GDPR, i.e. on the consent you have granted. You may withdraw your consent at any time without stating a reason, subject to lawful compliance of processing until the consent is withdrawn.
- 6. The following data recipients may have access to personal data: authorized employees of the Personal Data Controller and employees of the entity supervising the activity of the Personal Data Controller, as well as service providers and their authorized employees who, under an agreement, have been entrusted with the processing of personal data for the purpose of providing services to the Controller in connection with organization of the conference, in particular entities operating IT systems, and other services connected with organization of the conference. Access to a specific category of data (e.g. names, surnames, e-mail addresses, units you represent, specialization and research interests) will be also granted to other Conference participants for the purpose of exchanging information and professional contacts.

Your data that are necessary to confirm your participation in the Conference will be stored according to the rules applying to the OPI PIB consistent subject file index; other data will be deleted within 30 days as from the last day of the conference.
